

Floyd J. (Jack) Fowler, Ph.D., has been a Senior Research Fellow at the Center for Survey Research at the University of Massachusetts Boston since 1971. He co-founded the Center and served as its Director for 14 years. Dr. Fowler has also worked extensively with the Informed Medical Decisions Foundation, a non-profit organization devoted to informing and amplifying the voice of patients faced with medical decisions. He served as the President of the Foundation from 2002 until 2009. Dr. Fowler has been an author of a number of published papers dealing with a wide range of topics on which he has conducted research, including gambling, neighborhood crime, the effect of medical treatments on patients, and how patients make decisions. However, the main focus of his work has been survey methods and their effects on survey error. He is the author (or co-author) of four text books on survey methods as well as numerous articles and chapters on survey methodology. In 2013, he received the Award from the American Association of Public Opinion Research for Exceptionally Distinguished Achievement. He continues to spend some time at the Center for Survey Research and to provide some consultation to the Informed Medical Decisions Program, which is now a program housed at Massachusetts General Hospital.
